INDICATORS OF ABUSE

PHYSICAL / MEDICAL

- 1 Sleep difficulties insomnia, nightmares, sleep-walking, fear of the dark.
- 2 Physical abuse bruises, scratches, bite marks.
- 3 Depression low mood, self harm, suicide attempts.
- 4 Eating or feeding changes or difficulties.
- 5 Difficulty in walking or sitting.
- 6 Recurring urinary tract infections.
- 7 Vaginal infections or genital damage.
- 8 Itching and / or soreness.
- 9 Vague aches and pains.
- 10 Bedwetting and soiling.
- 11 Sexually transmitted diseases.
- 12 Pregnancy particularly with reluctance to name the father.
- 13 Dirty / unkempt.

BEHAVIOURAL

- 14 Fear of particular individual.
- 15 "Frozen watchfulness".
- 16. Flinching.
- 17. Withdraws from social relationships lack of trust in adults, poor peer relationships, unable or disinclined to make friends, feeling of difference.
- 18. Running away.
- 19. Pseudomature behaviour.
- 20. Blurred generational lines.

- 21. Sudden school problems truanting, poor concentration, falling standards, arriving early, leaving late, increasing isolation.
- 22. Low self esteem, poor sense of self and low expectation of others.
- 23. Offending behaviour non sexual sexual.
- 24. Drug, alcohol or solvent abuse.
- 25. Early, inappropriate sexualisation display of knowledge beyond child's years, sexual drawing and acting out, seductive or provocative behaviour, compulsive masturbation, (especially in public).
- 26. General obsessiveness fears, phobias, compulsive behaviour, e.g. washing.
- 27. Changes in personality / mood swings anxious, nervous, aggressive, disruptive behaviour.
- 28. Regressive behaviour e.g. clinging.
- 29. Overly compliant behaviour.
- 30. General anger / rage towards anyone / everyone which cannot be explained.
- 31. Prostitution.
- 32. Vulnerability to sexual exploitation.
- 33. Revulsion toward sex or close physical contact.
- 34. Cruelty toward others bullying.
- 35. Cruelty toward animals.
- 36. Arson.
- 37. General destructive behaviour.
- 38. Child is more private / secretive than children of a similar age, e.g. will not undress in front of anyone or use communal changing or washing areas.
