Kicking	Aggression (thumping walls, banging doors)
Stamping on	Expecting to be waited on
Dragging from a building or car	Deliberate humiliation / embarrassment

Shaking	Standing up / Leaving Stranded
Face shoved in food or mess	Denying use of vehicle

## Sexual Abuse can be....

Pressuring or blackmailing to get sex

Forced to participate in sexual acts, not practicing safe sex
Passing on sexually transmitted diseases (STDs)

Passing around private sexual pictures or videos
Sharing details of private sexual acts
Using objects or causing pain

Pressuring or forcing sex with friends / other people

Forcing the wearing of sexy clothes (or forced cover up)

Rape

Belittling, degrading, sexual humiliation

Using alcohol or drugs to get sex
Forced prostitution or involvement in the sex industry

## Financial Abuse can be...

Preventing access to family money
Taking out debt in partners name

Expecting unrealistic purchases/provisions on small budget (meals, outings etc.)
Destroying partner's credit rating – sometimes whilst keeping own intact
Taking or stealing partner's money
Theft or sale of partner's goods
Borrowing from partner's friends/family behind their back
Not involving partner in family finances or financial decisions
Refusing to fund basic purchases
Spending spare money on self, but not on rest of family or necessary goods

**Note:** These lists are not exhaustive and during the course of your work you are likely to encounter all forms of abuse – some that even the most experienced practitioner could not anticipate.
